### **SUMMARY AND ANALYSIS**

He current Library building is over sixty years old and in desperate need of large financial investment to bring the building up to date. Estimates run from \$1.3 million to address all deferred maintenance and ADA improvements up to \$3.9 million to add a needed expansion for adequate community space.

At the same time, the City, due to financial restrains has been forced to severely cut the Community Services Department over the past four years, reduce programming to the community and contracting out classes and program services to outside agencies.

Staff has been looking into alternate methods of addressing these two issues. The most viable solution identified would be to take over operation of the existing Recreation Center in Sierra Vista Park at the end of the lease with the YMCA in February of 2019. The building would be rebranded as the Sierra Madre Library and Cultural Center, a single-story addition would be constructed on the north side of the building to bring the total size of the building to 16,000 to 18,000 sq feet depending on funding levels. Library services would be moved from the currently library into the first floor of the new Cultural Center, with the second story left as 3,700 sq feet of flexible open space and classrooms for community events, classes, workshops, meeting rooms, youth programs, and community rentals. Both Library and Community Services staff would be housed in the same building to further the ability to share resources, supplement activities, reduce overhead costs and create new community programs.

In addition to an expanded Library space for the community, the City would return to offering community classes and educational programs, contract instruction workshops, and running adult sports leagues in Sierra Vista Park.

### **FINANCAL IMPACT**

\$3 million is the initial estimated cost of the project and the size of the addition can be scaled larger or smaller to match funding.

### **SUMMARY AND ANALYSIS**

The Sierra Madre Library and Cultural Center project has an initial estimate of \$3 million which includes an addition to the existing Recreation Center building, costs for relocating current Library services, shelving and furniture, and small improvements to the building.

These costs could be heavily funded by the sale of the City-owned property on which the current library building sits as well as the sale of the City-owned vacant property on the adjacent south of the current library building. The properties would be rezoned and sale of the properties would reduce or eliminate the likelihood of approaching the taxpayers for a bond measure or parcel assessment.

Restrictions on the sale of the current library lot expired in 1978. No restrictions are in place for the sale of the vacant lot behind the library.

#### FINANCAL IMPACT

Depending on how the property is rezoned and what development is allowed by the City the sale of the property is estimated to be \$2 to \$2.6 million. Remaining funding needs for the project would be meet through fundraising efforts.
