### **PUBLIC COMMENT**

Each speaker for Public Comment will be limited to five (5) continuous minutes, which may not be delegated. These rules will be enforced but may be changed by appropriate Tree Advisory Commission action.

The Commission will discuss the feasibility of the City's participation in the grant seeking process.

### 2. CALFIRE GRANT

The Commission will discuss and approve participation requirements and a timeline for the Community Forest Management Plan in order to complete the application for the CALFIRE grant.

# 3. CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

- a.) 0 Mariposa Ave., between 220 and 232 Mariposa Ave.; Review a construction project concerning three Coast Live Oaks *Quercus agrifolia*. Make recommendations of protective measures for protected trees to remain on property and provide mitigation recommendations regarding the trees that will be removed.
- b.) Southwest corner of Sierra Madre Blvd. and Sierra Place; Review a construction project adjacent to two Coast Live Oaks *Quercus agrifolia*. Make recommendations of protective measures for protected trees to remain on or adjacent to property and provide mitigation contingencies.
- 4. TRIMMING, REMOVAL & REPLACEMENT REQUESTS
- a.) 93 N. Baldwin Ave., (Highland) Side #9; Review a request from Bethany School to check the health and condition and trim or remove an Indian Laurel Fig Ficus microcarpa Nitidia' located in the parkway. Commission may authorize removal or substantial trimming, and determine the replacement species and quantity if removal is authorized.
- b.) 161 Adams St., Side #1; Review a request from a resident to trim an Indian Laurel Fig Ficus microcarpa 'Nitidia' located in the parkway. Commission may authorize substantial trimming.

- c.) 315 Grove St., Front #1; Review a request from a resident to remove a Jacaranda *Jacaranda mimosifolia* located in the parkway. Commission may authorize removal or substantial trimming, and determine the replacement species and quantity if removal is authorized.
- d.) 593 Ramona Ave., Front #1; Review a request from a resident to replace an Engelmann Oak *Quercus engelmannii* located in the parkway that was damaged and removed due to the December 1, 2011 Windstorm. Commission may determine the replacement species.
- e.) 6 E. Highland Ave., Front #1; Review a request from a resident to check the health and condition and trim or remove a Flaxleaf Paperbark *Melaleuca linariifolia* located in the parkway. Commission may authorize removal or substantial trimming, and determine the replacement species and quantity if removal is authorized.
- f.) 177 Merrill Ave., Front #2; Review a request from a resident to check the health and condition and trim an American Sweetgum Liquidambar styraciflua located in the parkway. Commission may authorize removal or substantial trimming, and determine the replacement species and quantity if removal is authorized.
- g.) 367 N. Lima St., Front #2; Review a request from a resident to check the health and condition of an Italian Cypress Cupressus sempervirens located in the parkway. Commission may authorize removal trimming, substantial and determine replacement species and quantity if removal is authorized.

h.) Sierra Vista Park, Heasley Field; Review a request from staff to check the health and condition of a Bottle Tree *Brachychiton populneus* located in the park. Commission may authorize removal or substantial trimming, and determine the replacement species and quantity if removal is authorized.

5. LARGE TREE PLANTING LOCATIONS

Commissioners will discuss the Olive Ave. Large Tree Planting Location plan brought by the subcommittee.

6. STREET TREE PALETTE REVIEW

The Commission will discuss the addition of new trees to the Street Palette: Cork Oak and Black Oak.
